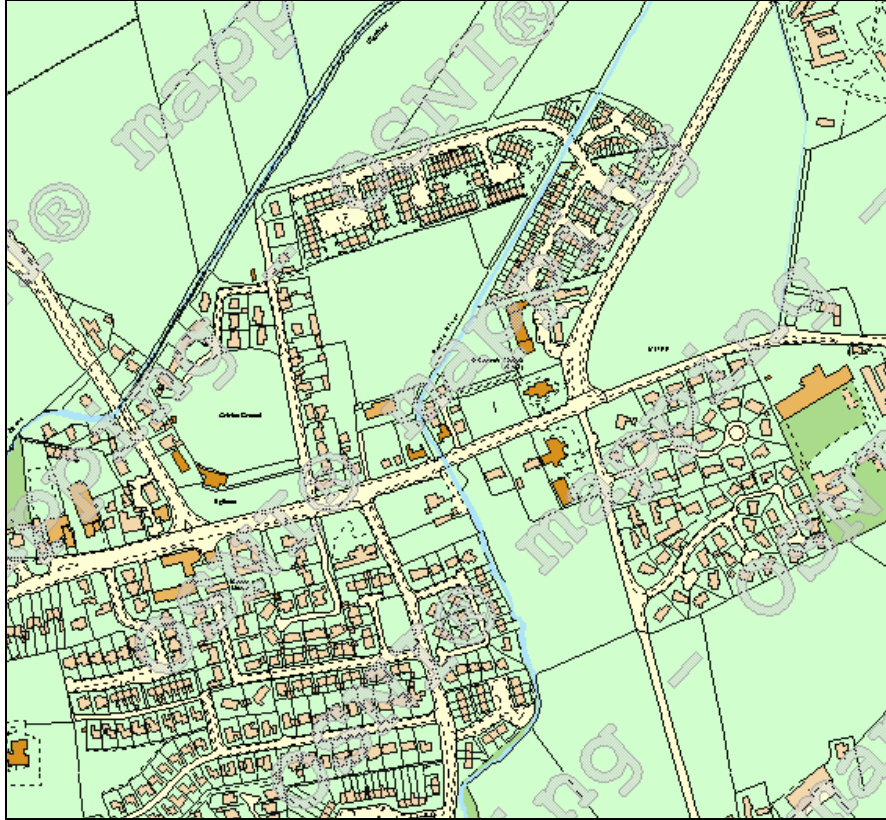
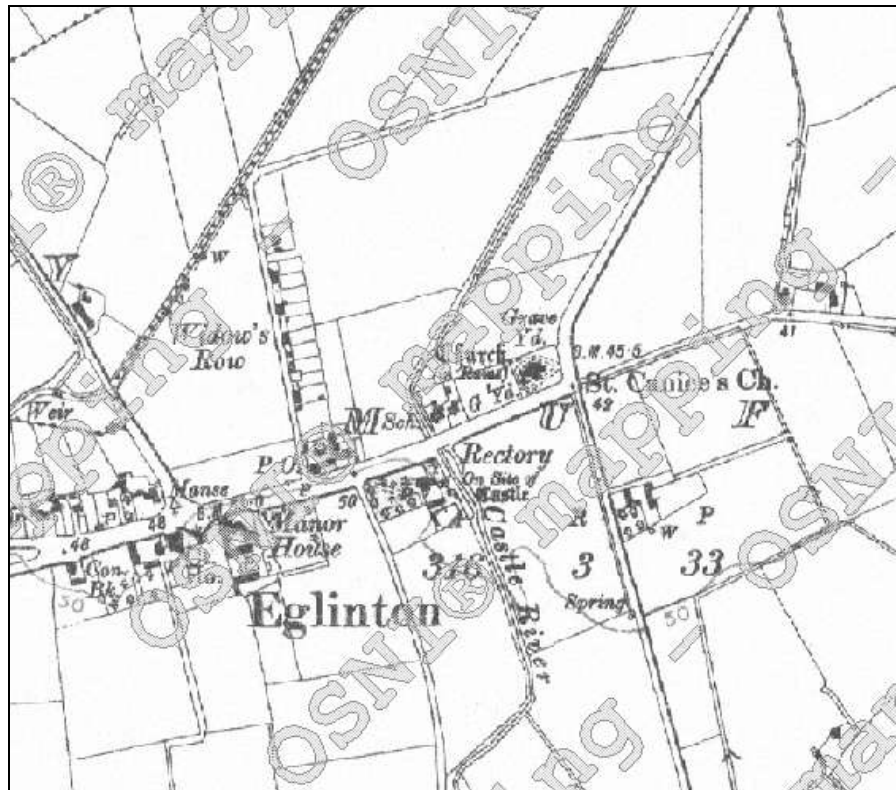

| Site Description | <p>The Raven map shown an unfortified house here at LDY015:008 at the NW corner of an attached bawn. There are circular flankers shown at the other 3 corners of the bawn. The church [LDY 015:009] & associated houses [LDY 015:033] shown are all Grocers Co. buildings. The bawn was besieged in 1641 & dismantled some years after. The site is shown on the 3rd & 4th editions of the OS 6" map as "Rectory on site of Castle".</p> <p>The church LDY015:009 was built between 1619 & 1622 as part of the Plantation village at Muff & became the parish church of Faughanvale at 1626, remaining so until a new church was built in 1826. The ruins of the church consist of the E gable & the grassed over courses of the rest of the walls. The church was rectangular, 18.3m long x 7.2m wide. The E gable stands to eaves height & contains a large, pointed-arch window of red sandstone with simple mouldings. Nothing of the tracery shown on the Raven map of 1622 survives. The wall is built of rubble & is supported at both ends by stepped buttresses. The entrance was on the S side & the lower courses of a porch extend from it.</p> <p>Raven's map of 1622 shows a variety of houses, W of the church & the House & Bawn [LDY 015:008 & 9]. The church & bawn can still be placed & the houses can be presumed to have been built along both sides of the street front running W from the church. Whether the present street width is equal of comparable to the original is unknown. Much of the significant area has been built on or is under gardens.</p> | |

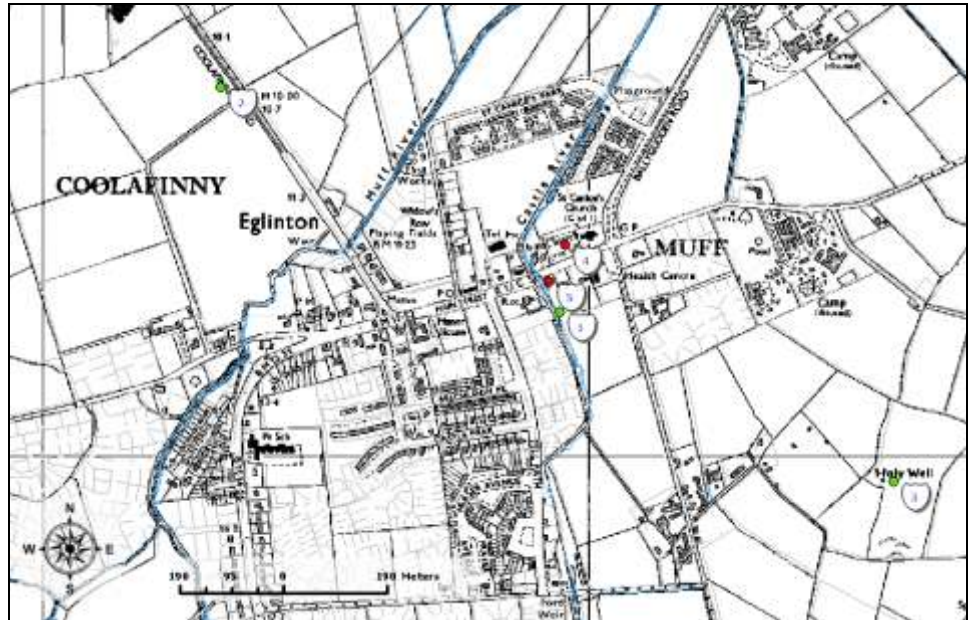
