


<b>Condition</b>	Well preserved	
<b>Ownership (if known)</b>		
<b>Site Description</b>	Set 3m W of a lane running N-S, this standing stone is on the W-facing slope of Avish Hill, with excellent views W & NE & reasonable views S. The stone is 1.02m high & 0.6m thick at the base. The top of the stone leans to SE. At the SW & W of the base there are 2 much smaller earthfast stones, possibly packing stones. It is locally reported that the stone was tumbled some years ago, but was promptly re-erected.	
<b>Landscape Context (setting)</b>	Set on W-facing slope of Avish Hill, with excellent views W & NE over the LCA and reasonable views S.	
<b>Site Appraisal</b>	A well preserved stone and a good example of its type.	
<b>Sensitivity</b>	Set 3m W of a laneway; easily accessible in this regard and may be susceptible to human interference/regular visits; There is local records that it has already been tumbled and re-erected.	
<b>Associations</b>	Indicative of prehistoric settlement in the region and the possible need for landscape territorial markers.	
<b>Recommendations</b>	A good example of its type, easily accessible on foot and good for training demo/guided tour/individual tourist experience with the added advantage of being able to view and appreciate the surrounding landscape. O.S. FIELD REPORT NO.111	




